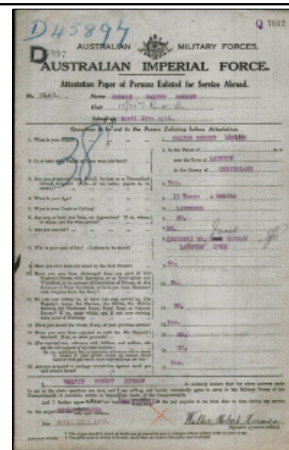

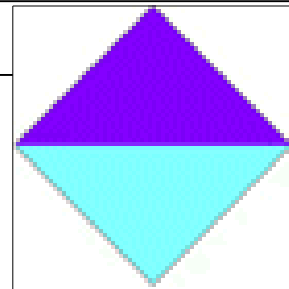

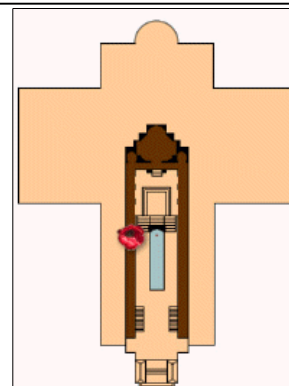
4. Embarkation on Overseas Service: on "HMAT Clan McGillivray", 7 Sep 1916, Brisbane, Qld, Australia.

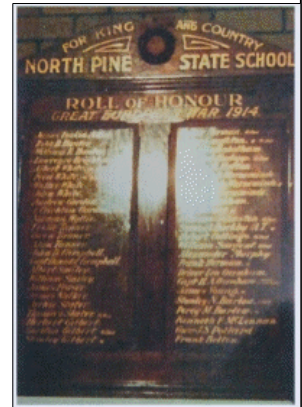
7. Military Awards: British War Medal, 1919.



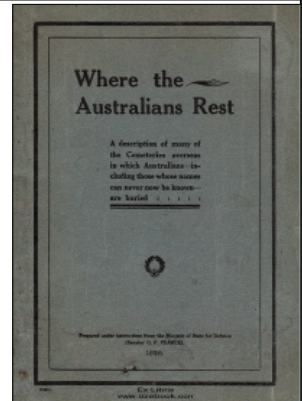
8. Military Awards: Victory Medal, 1919.




