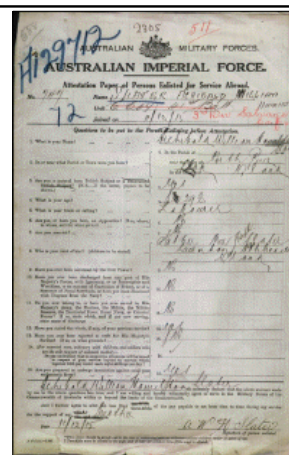

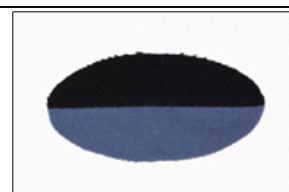

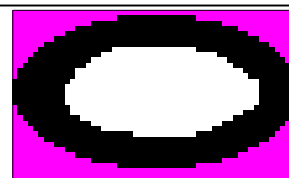
1. Military Enlistment: Army #747, 11 Dec 1915, Townsville, Qld, Australia.

<p>SLATER, Archibald William Hamilton, D.C.M. Corpl., 41st Battalion Born and educated at Northpine. The son of John Joseph and Catherine Slater, of Lawnton. Enlisted at Cairns and sailed for England and thence for France. Won the D.C.M. for continued acts of gallantry and devotion to duty during the period from 25th February to 17th September, 1918. Kept his squadron together under most trying circumstances, including destruction of their dwelling on six separate occasions. On 12th April, 1918, near Buire, an aeroplane was lying derelict close to the track along which rations were carried, one of the bombs having its detonator exposed. The spot was under enemy observation and subject to shell fire. He made three trips and saved the bombs, thus removing the danger to the ration carriers.</p> <p>Photo Page 239</p>
