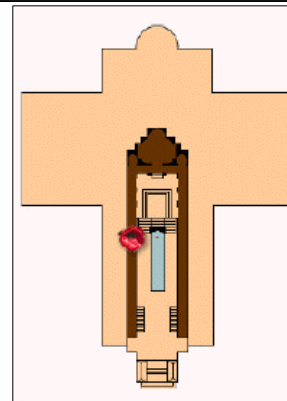

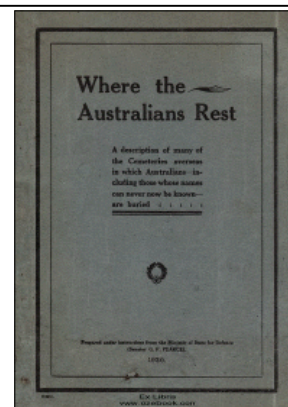

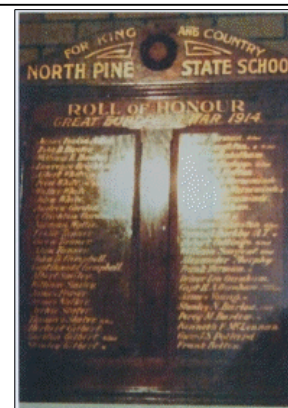
13. Australian War Memorial Roll of Honour: Panel 106, 1919, Canberra, ACT, Australia.



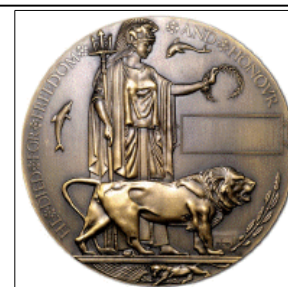
14. Honour Board / Roll of Honour / Memorial: "Where the Australians Rest", 17 Dec 1919, Canberra, ACT, Australia.





<p>WHITE, Frederick Alexander. Sergeant, No. 4782. Born at North Pine, and educated at North Pine State School. Son of the late James and the late Angelina Elizabeth White. Enlisted in November, 1915, and sailed for Salisbury Plain in June, and sent to France in August. Was wounded in the ear on 13th November and sent to England. Returned to the firing line and was wounded in the shoulder on 20th March, 1917; again returned to the firing line and in September, 1917, got trench feet and invalided to England. Returned to the firing line in March, 1918, and was killed at the battle of Moulencourt on 10th June, 1918.</p> <p>Photo Page 256</p>
